LIVE THE HISTORY!



The Black Horse was initially formed in Fauquier County in 1859 as a Virginia militia volunteer cavalry company. The unit guarded John Brown at Harper's Ferry prior to his execution. With the secession of Virginia from the United States, it was mustered into the service of the Commonwealth of Virginia in May of 1861. At First Manassas, it initially guarded the commander but was later released to pursue the retreating Federals. As part of a squadron composed of the Black Horse Troop, Captain Payne and the Chesterfield Troop, Captain Ball, under the overall command of Lt. Col. Thomas T. Munford, it pursued the Federals to Cub Run and captured ten rifled cannon, their caissons, and forty-six horses. The company later became Company H of the 4th Virginia Cavalry Regiment. The 4th Virginia Cavalry was comprised of companies from Prince William, Chesterfield, Madison, Culpeper, Powhatan, Goochland, Hanover, Warren, and Buckingham counties, some of the finest sons of the "Old Dominion".

The roster of the Black Horse included a great many young men from the oldest and most established families of Fauquier County, in the heart of Virginia's horse country. Many had honed their skills for years before the War in foxhunting and at the jousting tournaments held in Fauquier Springs, and rapidly adapted those skills to the needs of cavalry in wartime. The Black Horse served from First Manassas to Appomattox Court House, participating in every major battle and campaign that involved the Army of Northern Virginia and never surrendering their colors. The unit produced three brigadier generals and numerous post-war elected officials.

*The present Black Horse is a group of living historians established for the purpose of challenging their horses and each other in accurately reenacting and honoring cavalymen of the past. They attempt to equip and train as authentic, disciplined Confederate cavalry. The reenacting unit was founded in 1972 and participates in Civil War battle reenactments, living histories, presentations for the public, and films. Strong emphasis is placed on developing skills of a cavalryman, and members are expected to attend drills and hone their skills.*

### **General Information**

Participants may arrive beginning at 7:45 AM. Upon arrival, please check-in with ride officials. All riders must be in the saddle at 9:00 AM and **ready to ride**. Upon mounting, you will receive an historical overview and then enjoy a brief demonstration that reflects the authenticity and dedication to the unit and its history. You will be divided into small groups based on your preferred ride speed and assigned a guide leader.

Unless prevented by weather conditions, the "long" trail course will leave Manassas Battlefield Park in order to view the Sudley Ford crossing, portions of the unfinished railroad, and the Sudley Springs crossing. The speed of all groups including the walk/trot/canter group may be reduced/limited by weather, trail conditions and safety. This

ride will include water crossings, narrow trails, and maneuvering muddy banks in and out of Bull Run, Young's Branch, Catharpin Run, and others. **Horses should be prepared for water crossings in advance. Be prepared to be in the saddle for 3 to 4 hours and ride about 12 miles. If you do not feel you or your horse can handle that time and distance, PLEASE request the shorter ride.**

Upon your return from the ride, lunch and refreshments await you. Lunches will be boxed or bagged for take-away. Participants are encouraged to bring their own seating and enjoy lunch at their trailer area. BES will not be providing any extra seating. There may be the opportunity to meet the members of the Black Horse Cavalry before or after the ride, but please be mindful of the COVID-19 precautions noted below.

Ample trailer parking is available. Parking attendants will be onsite for ease and coordination – please obey the requests of the attendants. You may choose to bring your own water or there will be an onsite water buffalo for you to fill your own water buckets (no common water trough). Portable rest room facilities are available. For the safety of the horses, riders and volunteers, please leave your dogs/pets at home. Due to liability, BES does not allow non-registered friends/riders to ride along or park their trailer at the event site.

### **COVID-19 Precautions**

Currently, the Park requires masks to be worn in all outdoor areas where people cannot safely social distance. In order to comply with CDC guidelines and protect our riders and volunteers, masks are *required* at the registration table and at the lunch/beverage tent. If you are unable to wear a mask, please send someone with a mask to pick up your registration packet and lunch/beverage. Contact the Ride Secretary if assistance will be needed with pick-up. Masks are strongly recommended when on foot and unable to maintain social distancing. Masks are not required while mounted but may be worn if desired.

### **Registration/Cost**

*Due to COVID-19, pre-registration is required for all riders. No late entries or walk-ins will be accepted. Incomplete entries (missing paperwork or payment) will not be accepted. Entries must be received with all required documentation and be paid in full no later than Wednesday, June 16<sup>th</sup>. Entry fees are non-refundable unless the ride is cancelled.*

The liability waiver and Coggins may be submitted electronically via the online registration form or mailed in with your payment. All payments must be provided via PayPal invoice or mailed and received by Wednesday, June 16<sup>th</sup>. One lunch and bottled water are included in your entry fee.

**Your registration must be complete including application, liability waiver, Coggins, and full payment before your registration is accepted.**

The following must be submitted with your registration entry:

- Completed Registration Form (one for each rider).
- Signed Waiver (one for each rider).
- Copy of current negative Coggins (dated within 12 months of ride date)
- Entry fee: Either to be invoiced via PayPal or Check or Money Order made payable to “BES” or “Battlefield Equestrian Society”

### **Directions**

From I-66, take Exit 47 onto Route 234 North. Travel ~1.4 miles and turn right at the light onto Route 29 North (Stone House is on the corner). Travel less than a mile and look for signs on the right. Ride base is located between the Stone House and the Stone Bridge on Route 29.

### **Inclement Weather Policy**

The event will be held rain or shine but may be cancelled if weather or trail conditions are considered to be hazardous. If the event is cancelled, you will be notified by email (by phone if no email available) by 8:00 PM the evening prior to the ride. If field conditions prevent parking in the Park, an alternative parking site may be used. Again, any parking changes will be communicated by email (phone if no email) by 8:00 PM the night prior to the ride.

## Release and Waiver of Liability

I am a participant, not a spectator, engaged in an equine activity. I am aware that equine activities, whether riding or not, poses potentially serious risks of injuries or death to its participants. I understand that my horse or I may be injured or die as a result of my negligence, the negligence of others, or through no fault of myself or anyone else, because of the nature of the activity in which I am going to be engaged. I also understand that horses, even the best trained, are often unpredictable and difficult to control.

With this waiver I accept notice of the provision of Section 3.1-796.130 through 3.1-796.133 of the Code at Virginia, which states in part: That there are inherent risks in equine activities, including (i) the propensity of an equine to behave in dangerous ways which may result in injury to the participant; (ii) the inability to predict an equine's reaction to sound, movements objects, persons or animals; and (iii) hazards of surface or subsurface conditions. The waiver shall remain valid unless expressly revoked by the participant or parent or guardian of a minor, in writing, with receipt acknowledged by at least one of the officers or directors of the Battlefield Equestrian Society (BES).

Furthermore, with this document, I expressly assume the risk of injury or death due to negligence by the BES, its officers, directors, members, agents, employees, and staff, or guests for my own safety or for the safety of my minor child or horse. If this or any other provision of this Agreement is held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be unimpaired.

With the knowledge of the foregoing, and as an inducement for the officers, directors, and members of BES to allow my participation, I do hereby waive and release any and all rights that I or my heirs may have to make a claim against the BES or its members; the owners, tenants or others of interest of any property over which I may pass, ride, or by any other means be; and other participants (including guides, planners, judges, or others) arising from any damages, injury, or death which I might sustain or which might occur to any horse as a result of my participation in this equine activity. I further agree to indemnify all of the foregoing from any claims which I might make or which might be made on my behalf by others or which might be made against me by others arising from riding with the BES or following or participating on foot or by automobile. Furthermore, I agree to indemnify the BES and its members for any injury, death, and loss of or damage to any personal property, which I might cause during this equine activity.

I further acknowledge and accept that BES strongly suggests that I will wear an approved hard hat/helmet while participating in this ride.

By signing this release and waiver, I understand that I am giving up any right I have to sue or make a claim which I might have or which might subsequently arise or occur against the BES and its members and participants for any injuries I might sustain while horseback riding or present or following or participating on foot or by automobile and that I am indemnifying BES and its members if I injure anyone else, another's property, or any horse ridden by another while so engaged. It is my intent to give up those rights, and I do so knowingly and voluntarily.
